

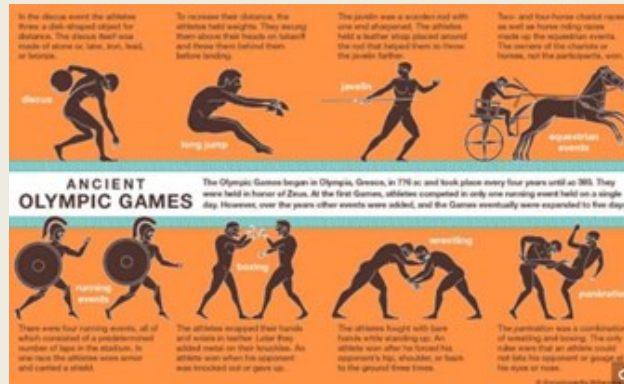

This half term, the Year 4 history topic is the Ancient Greeks with the focus on answering the question of, 'How democratic actually were the Ancient Greeks?'. Next, using our knowledge of the Hellenic city-states, we will be learning about the various wars which took place throughout these times, including how different democratic societies, such as Sparta and Athens, were run by those in charge.

Year 1s and 2s—The Study of Claude Monet



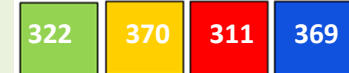
