Audience: For Year 6 students who have been completing Eedi for their homework.

Description: Creator of Eedi and Maths guru Craig Barton has analysed how Year 6 students have responded to the multiple choice questions on Eedi. Genius Maths

Audience: Key Stage 2 students wanting to revise specific areas of mathematics

Description: A revision programme. Originally designed for Year 6 students for SATs revision, but good for avid mathematicians from Year 3 upwards. Students can choose from 48 maths topics such as 'mean averages', 'pictograms' and 'translate shapes' and then try out a few related questions from past SATs paper. The best part of this website is that each question has a Youtube link where a teacher shows you how to solve the question, step by step.

White Rose

Audience: Year 1 upwards

Description: Similar to the Eedi programme that Year 6 currently use for their homework. You will need to sign up but I understand that this is free. Scroll down to the quizzes section and select a year group. Select a topic. Choose a quiz to do. There are 10 multiple choice answer questions. Students select their answer and then they have the option to explain their thinking.

Corbett Maths

Audience: Although the website is titled 'Primary Maths' this is more geared to Key Stage 2 in my opinion.

Description: Students can choose from '5-a-day' or 'videos and worksheets.' 5-a-day takes you to a range of calendar dates. Each date has a range of levels: bronze, silver, gold and platinum. Bronze is the easiest. Students select their preferred level and are taken to 5 questions to complete. These can be printed. In the 'videos and worksheets' area, students choose a maths topic, watch a short video and then complete a set of related questions. Answers are provided.
