Recommended KS2 daily activities:

ENGLISH:

- Fronted Adverbials
LO: to identify fronted adverbials in sentences
LO: to identify the uses of fronted adverbials
LO: to use fronted adverbials in sentences to add detail
- Rhetorical Questions
LO: to identify rhetorical questions
LO: to use rhetorical questions

MATHS:

- Roman Numerals
LO: to write (Arabic) numbers as Roman Numerals
to read Roman Numerals and translate into Arabic numbers
- Decimal Numbers
LO: to understand the value of the different parts of a decimal number
- Counting on and back
LO: to count on and back in 100s, 1000s and 10,000s starting on larger numbers

HISTORY:

- Go to the suggested Ancient Greece BBC website, make notes and then log on to Purple Mash to write up an Ancient Greek gods and goddesses fact file. DKFindout is another suggested source of information and there are also some audio stories to listen to.
LO: to name and learn facts about gods and goddesses worshipped by the Ancient Greeks

LO: to know and explain the phases of the moon
