5. Name all the counties that border Nottinghamshire. *South Yorkshire, Lincolnshire, Leicestershire and Derbyshire*
6. What is the highest point in Surrey and in south east England called and how many metres above sea level is it? *Leith Hill, 294 metres above sea level*
7. Where was the first tractor invented in 1902? *Biggleswade, Bedfordshire*
8. Where was Sir Winston Churchill born? *Blenheim Palace, Oxfordshire*
9. In which county would you find the UK's largest vineyard? *Surrey*
10. Why does Luton Town Football Club have the nickname of 'the hatters'? *This nickname reflects the connection between Luton and the hat making trade.*
11. Salisbury Cathedral has the tallest what in Britain? *spire*
12. The River Thames flows through Oxford, but what is it called here? *River Isis*
13. More than half of the population of Bedfordshire live in which two towns? *Bedford and Luton*
14. The Shah Jahan Mosque in Woking, Surrey dates back to which year? *1889*
15. When was the worlds first iron bridge erected over the River Severn? *1779*
