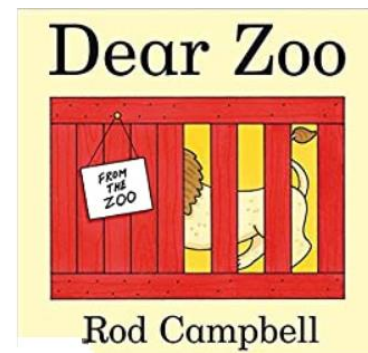
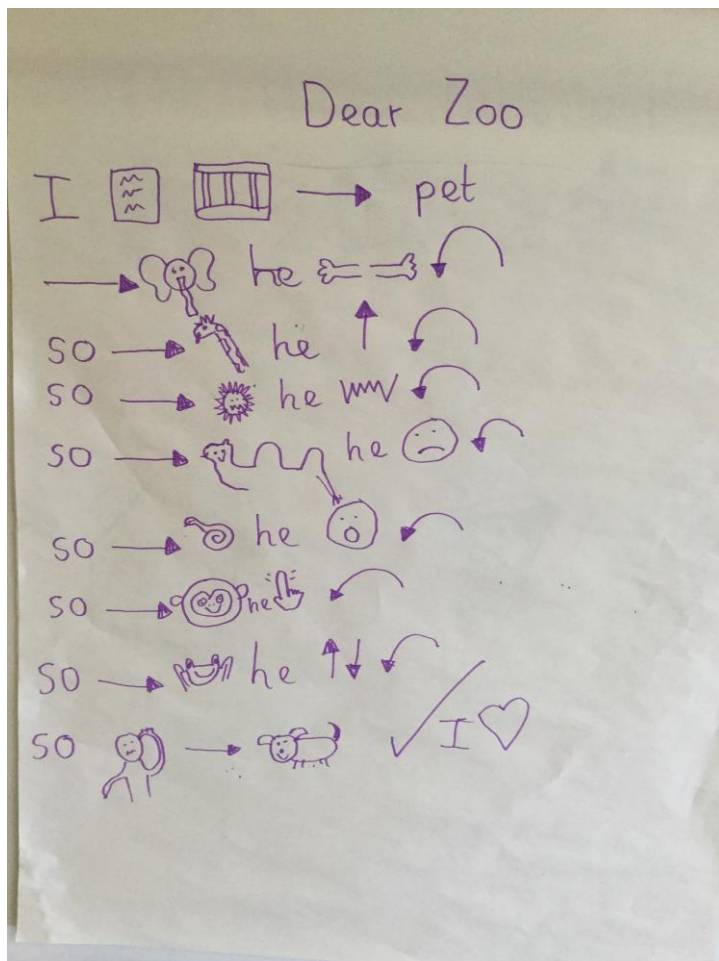
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### Writing



Use your version of the Dear Zoo story map to recreate the book. Start with your title page and then include a picture and sentence on each page. You could even try and add flaps to cover your pet pictures.

Remember to check your sentences to make sure they have capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Have you spelled your Tricky Troll words correctly?

Use this week's Sentence Stimuli document to write a daily sentence about each of the pictures. Can you think what these pictures might have in common? Remember to check your sentence once you have finished for capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Can you read your writing? Does your sentence make sense? Some children may want to write more than one sentence.

*It is important to remember that when your child is writing, they will be 'sounding out' words and recording the sounds they can hear. This will mean that a high proportion of their writing is not spelt correctly, but phonetically. This is appropriate for their age and how we teach writing at school, however we would expect them to be spelling some Tricky Troll words correctly from the earlier sets. If your child asks how to write something, encourage them to sound it out or remind them if it is a Tricky Troll word that they already know.*
