

**Column Subtraction – Expanded**  
**2 digit from 3 digit (with an exchange)**

When writing down calculations, separate the numbers into ones, tens, hundreds and thousands.

List the numbers in a column and always start subtracting with the ones first.

**HELPFUL NOTE:**

When you exchange a 10, make sure to change the brackets underneath too!

**Tasks**
