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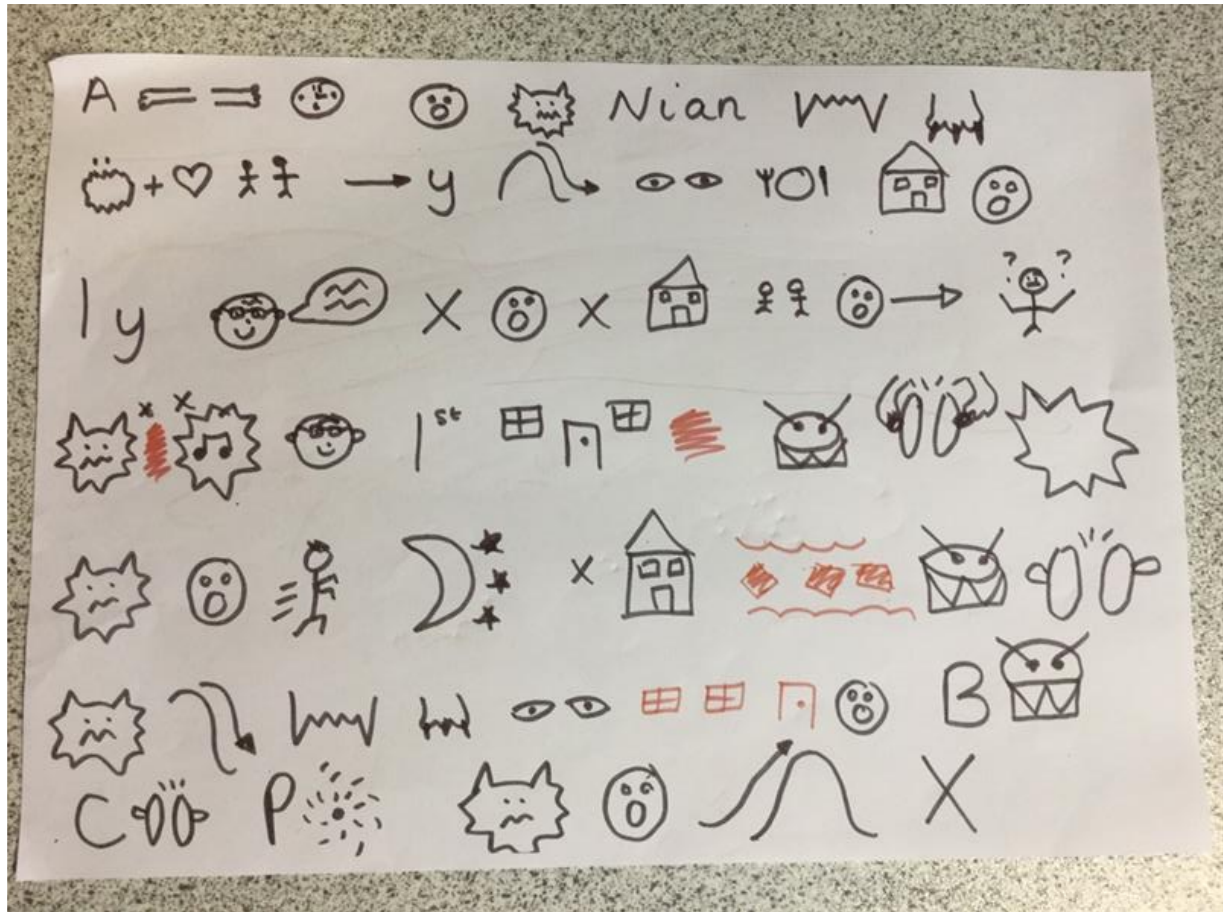
Writing

Read through the story of Nian to help you remember the story. It is quite long and it has been quite a while since we learnt it. Draw your own story map to try and help you remember the story. Give your story map a title and label any bits that you can (eg bang, crash, pop, drum).

Try and remember the actions (or make up your own actions) to go along with the story.

Can you retell the story using your story map and with your actions?

Use this week's Sentence Stimuli document to write a daily sentence about each of the pictures. Remember to check your sentence once you have finished for capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Can you read your writing? Does your sentence make sense? Some children may want to write more than one sentence.

It is important to remember that when your child is writing, they will be 'sounding out' words and recording the sounds they can hear. This will mean that a high proportion of their writing is not spelt correctly, but phonetically. This is appropriate for their age and how we teach writing at school, however we would expect them to be spelling some Tricky Troll words correctly from the earlier sets. If your child asks how to write something, encourage them to sound it out or remind them if it is a Tricky Troll word that they already know.
