### DI

We use inference to find out about a person's feelings and actions using the clues given in text (by 'reading between the lines').

We also use inference in our own writing when we describe characters by '**showing, not telling**' how they are feeling. By giving details about **how** a person does something by describing their body language, facial expressions and the manner in which they do things, we can infer how a person is feeling and the reasons for their actions. Remember, **adverbs** help to tell us more about verbs for example:

Sally **smiled** **curiously** when she spotted a crocodile.
