TASK: Here are two of the characters from the story – The Wind in the Willows.

In the boxes below are some words to describe each of the characters. **Add** to them anything else you can think of. Then use these adjectives to write sentences that compare them. Remember you make a comparative by adding the 'er' suffix to the end of the word. See the example below.



Toad	Badger
Fast	Slow
young	Old
rich	clever
fashionable	sensible

Badger is **older** than Toad.

Beware: Some words don't work with 'er'. Sometimes we have to add 'more' to the beginning.

Sensible doesn't become sensibler.....that is not a word. We would say 'more sensible'.

Badger is **more sensible** than Toad.
