globalisation	<b>Globalisation</b> is the process by which the world is becoming connected with each other.
culture	<b>Culture</b> is a word for people's way of life. Many different things make up peoples' culture. These things include food, language, clothing, tools, music, arts, customs, beliefs, and religion.
imports	<b>Imports</b> are goods brought into a country.
exports	<b>Exports</b> are goods sent to another country.
trade bloc	A <b>trade bloc</b> is where countries group together to promote trade.
borders	<b>Borders</b> are the official lines that separates two countries or areas.
Europeans	<b>Europeans</b> are people that are born, raised or living in Europe.
identities	An <b>identity</b> is the qualities, beliefs, traditions and culture that make a particular person or group different from others.
governments	A <b>government</b> is a group of people that has this power and authority. They make laws and decisions that affect all of the people that live in the area.
The European Coal and Steel Community	<b>The European Coal and Steel Community</b> is a group of countries that worked together to produce coal and steel. It was created in 1952 after World War II.
Community	A <b>community</b> is a group of people who live close together or have shared interests.
economic	<b>Economic</b> is to do with the economy – in other words, to do with money, business, jobs and trade.
common market	The <b>common market</b> was created to make it easier for countries to trade together.
neighbouring countries	<b>Neighbouring countries</b> are countries which share a border.
European Union	The <b>European Union</b> is a group of countries whose governments work together. It was created in 1992 and was previously known as the common market.
citizens	A <b>citizen</b> is a person who lives in and has the rights given by a town or city.
migration	<b>Migration</b> means when people move from one place to another to live – not just for a holiday!
emigrants	An <b>emigrant</b> is someone who leaves one country or region in order to settle in another.
immigrants	An <b>immigrant</b> is someone who settles in a country in which they were not born.
push factors	<b>Push factors</b> are the reasons why people leave an area.
pull factors	<b>Pull factors</b> are the reasons why people are attracted to an area.
migrants	A <b>migrant</b> is a person who moves from one place to another, especially in order to find work or better living conditions
refugee	A <b>refugee</b> is a person who has moved to a new country because of a problem in their home country.
asylum	<b>Asylum</b> is a place that offers safety.
