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Raptors in Reception



In Reception, inspired by the story 'Owl Babies', the pupils have been learning facts about owls. They have found out that some owls are nocturnal, that they can turn their heads almost all the way round and they can land on one leg if they are using the other to hold food! The pupils have also dissected owl pellets and found evidence about what owls like to eat.

The children were supposed to have a visit from the Raptor Foundation so they could see the owls close up. Unfortunately, this could not go ahead due to bird flu restrictions imposed on the Raptor Foundation. Instead, our wonderful WSA funded a Zoom experience for the pupils. Even though the children could not see the owls in the flesh, Raptor Foundation staff gave detailed explanations about different owls on the Zoom call, pupils

were able to ask questions and they actually got a really close up view of the owls so it was still a really lovely experience for them.
