


## Rivers

Important facts
The River <b>Indus</b> is one of the longest rivers in the world.
The River Indus passes through <b>India</b> and <b>Pakistan</b> .
The water from the River Indus makes it possible for many <b>crops</b> to grow.
The River <b>Severn</b> is the <b>longest</b> river in the <b>UK</b> .
The flat land around the River Severn has very good soil for <b>farming</b> .

Key vocabulary	
stream	Where water collects and starts to flow (the upper course)
monsoon	The wet season in Southern Asia
mouth	Where the river meets the sea
tributaries	Smaller rivers which flow into bigger rivers
course	The path a river takes from its source to its mouth
source	Where a river begins its journey, often on mountains
meander	The way a river curves on flatter land
estuary	The part of the river that flows into the sea
dam	A barrier built across a river or stream to hold back water
reservoir	A large body of water that stores water for later use
