In 2012/2013, the funding allocated was £623 for each child who has claimed Free School Meals in the last six years and £250 for each child who is looked after or has parents in the Armed Forces.

Nature of our Spending 2012/2013

During this academic year, Pupil Premium funding was used to support the learning and engagement of eligible children in a variety of ways, including:

- Financial support for Residential trips
- Specialist Teacher
- Coffee afternoons for vulnerable groups
- · Learning resources to support specific pupils

Outcomes 2012/2013

- At the end of KS1 our FSM pupil's attainment was above their non FSM peers in Maths and
 Writing but in reading there was no gap.
- At the end of KS1 the Average Point Score for our FSM pupils and those with SEN (SA+ and ST) exceeded the national average in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- At the end of KS2 the % of SA+ pupils achieving age expected levels in Reading, Writing and
 Maths combined exceeded the national levels.
- At the end of KS2 the % of FSM pupils achieving age expected levels in Reading, Writing and Maths combined exceeded national levels. However for Reading, Writing and Maths individually, for FSM pupils, attainment at the end of KS2 was lower than national levels.
